How you can help your child to learn at home

Please continue to support your child with focusing on their handwriting and ensure they are listening for the phonemes (sounds) in words, including the long vowel sounds. They should be using a range of strategies and high frequency words using the school's handwriting formation. Please keep hearing your child read and read to them as often as you can.

Keep using the phonics flash cards that we send home throughout the term. The weekly phonics sheet has all the sounds and words we are working on. Please encourage your child to read and have a go at writing these words.
